Article V. Membership

9.0 Classes of Memberships:

9.1. Class A – with all the qualifications already set out in Sections 10.1 to 10.9:

- 10.1. Are Indigenous regardless of status or are married to, or have a common-law relationship with, an Indigenous individual;
- 10.2. Are 18 years of age or older;
- 10.3. Are not an employee of the Friendship Centre;
- 10.4. Normally residing in the City of Ottawa or within 50 kms of the Ottawa city centre (the “Catchment area”);
- 10.5. Agree to uphold the Code of Ethics;
- 10.6. Have paid the annual membership fee and has been approved by the Board of Directors, or has been approved by the Board of Directors as a member in good standing;
- 10.7. Support the Aims and Objectives of the Friendship Centre;
- 10.8. Support the continued development of Indigenous culture and traditional ways; and, agree to conduct themselves according to the policies and procedures of the Friendship Centre; and
- 10.9. The Board of the ONFC has the authority to grant honorary lifetime status to a member in consideration for the member's past contributions to the ONFC. Honorary lifetime status means that the member shall enjoy all the privileges of membership and shall no longer be required to pay membership fees.

9.2. Class B – with all the qualifications already set out in Sections 10.10:

- 10.10. Class B - equivalent to your “Friends of the Friendship Centre” set out in 10.10. This would be a non-voting class of members open to persons who do not qualify for regular (Class A) membership and to organizations.

11.0 Application for membership in the Friendship Centre is open to all persons who:

- 11.1. The status of Class B, "Friends of the Friendship Centre" shall be granted to Indigenous or non-Indigenous people, who are 18 years of age and older, who are not otherwise eligible to hold membership, but have made significant contributions to the ONFC, to the Friendship Centre movement or the Indigenous community. They shall be non-voting members, eligible for all the benefits of membership aside from voting privileges.
